• Entrepreneurship and Empowerment in Haiti

The Warrington College of Business' Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation (CEI) offers multiple ways that students can develop skills in entrepreneurship while at UF. Assessment of Contaminants in Haitian Waterways

Since 2009, about 3 Environmental & Global Health (EGH) Masters of Public Health students spend part of their internship in Gressier, Haiti each year. In 2015, the EGH MPH students spent part of their internship collecting water samples from wells, rivers and streams to determine if the waters contained contaminants with hormonal activity, which pose potential health risks. They have also partnered with the FISH ministries, which has been working to increase the access to clean water in Haitian communities for over 20 years. Haiti Research Lab

Haiti Research Lab is one of the most notable achievements of UF's engagement with Haiti. Established in 2011 by the University of Florida Emerging Pathogens Institute (EPI), the Haiti Research Lab facility focuses on research in ecology, epidemiology, genetics and genomics of microbial pathogens responsible for cholera and chronic diarrheal illness and works to prevent or contain re-emerging diseases. The research lab partners with the Christianville Foundation Inc. in Gressier, Haiti to provide services to schools and the community. This lab is funded through the College of Medicine, EPI, CDC Haiti and Ministry of Health.
