On February 3, 2015, the University of Florida College of Design, Construction, and Planning established a joint-degree reciprocal agreement with the most prestigious public university in Indonesia, the University of Indonesia. This initiative allows University of Indonesia students to complete their undergraduate degree within UF's Interior Design Program.

Dr. Christopher Silver of the College of Design, Construction, and Planning collaborated with Cardiff University of Wales and the University of Indonesia-Depok. In October 2015, this collaboration resulted in a Joint International Stakeholder Workshop of Global Innovation Initiative Project: "Novel Approaches of Employing GI to Enhance Urban Sustainability" held in Indonesia, which focused on innovative approaches to green infrastructure to build greater urban stability in the greater Jakarta region. Students from all three universities will be returning to Jakarta in January 2016 to continue this work.
