Lisa Iglesias received a BA from Binghamton University and MFA from the University of Florida. Iglesias's research involves project-based art works grounded in contemporary approaches

to drawing and painting as well as collaborative studio practices. She has attended residencies at the Fine Arts Work Center in Provincetown, Virginia Center for the Creative Arts and Bemis Center for Contemporary Arts, among others. Iglesias has exhibited at a variety of spaces including El Museo del Barrio, the Jersey City Museum and the Queens Museum of Art. Lisa participates in The University Minority Mentor Program, received a SEC Visiting Faculty Grant and "Teacher of the Year" award for the College of the Arts in 2015 and a 2016 College-level Excellence Award for Assistant Professors. The Architecture and Fine Arts Library recently acquired over fifty books focusing on creative work by underrepresented communities made possible by Lisa's 2016 Library Enhancement Grant through UF's Center for the Humanities and the Public Sphere.
