After college, Dr. Miller took three years to work a variety of biology jobs and to travel the world. She drew on these experiences when she started a Ph.D. program in Organismal Biology and Ecology at the University of Montana. Her Ph.D. research took her to the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute in Panama. Dr. Miller started at UF in 2007 as an Assistant Research Scientist and was promoted to Assistant Professor in 2011.
