She has developed and led several faculty-led study abroad programs to countries in the Caribbean. Most recently, Dr. Alexander-Delpech developed and led a community-based culturally appropriate breast health awareness program in Grenada. The program was guided by a community-based philosophy of health care and social planning. The program trained Lay Community Health Workers (LCHW) in breast health and how to train women to conduct breast selfexaminations.
