#### **Variety of Funding Sources:**

- Federal
- State
- Foundations
- UF internal funding



#### **Types of Funding:**

- Project Grants highly competitive, given for scientific, research, technology development, education, social services, the arts and health care
- Formula Grants provides funds as dictated by law (e.g. Aid to Families with Dependent Children)
- Earmark Grants special appropriations by U.S. Congress



#### **Federal Sponsors**

Federal funds are provided and administered by federal agencies.

Federal funding is characterized as follows:

- It is responsive to legislative mandate
- It is accountable to Congress for outcome and performance
- Includes projects of global, national or specific program significance
- Review is in accordance with agencies stated criteria (impartial review process)
- Some RFP's may request services: usually in specific locations, deliverables of a specific nature
- Competitive: your application must stand out!

#### **State of Florida**



State of Florida provides funding opportunities which are characterized as follows:

- Must fund projects with utility for the state
- May identify areas of need and request projects to meet specific needs
- May target specific geographic areas
- Competition is usually only from in-state organizations
- May fund projects that match their state mandates (e.g., Department of Agricultural and Consumer Services, Department of Education

#### Foundations

Private Foundations:

- Different types of foundations: corporate affiliated, family, etc.
- Must make awards according to their IRS determination
- Review process is often very fluid; personal contact is important
- When possible call for additional information as needed. Some foundations are small and their staff may not accept multiple calls
  - When in doubt, always ask
- Unless they are national in scope, tend to fund "in their own backyard"
- Generally will use grants with flexible budget as mechanism of award
